Industrial Action by PPTA Members

Following on from the strike action last Wednesday, members of the Post Primary Teacher's Association (PPTA) will be involved in further industrial action in the coming weeks. This is part of action that is being taken throughout NZ.

From next week, teachers will be involved in 'rostering home' – this means that teachers who are PPTA members (and that is most of our teachers) will not teach particular year levels on particular days.

The schedule of action is:

Tuesday 4th June	Year 9
Tuesday 11th June	Year 10
Tuesday 25th June	Year 11
Tuesday 2nd July	Year 12

This won't affect year 9 students on 4th June, as the school had already notified a Teacher only Day (and so there won't be students at school on that day).

It will however affect students at year 10, 11 and 12 on the dates indicated above. This means that classes will not run for year 10 students on 11th June, for year 11 students on 25th June and for year 12 students on 2nd July.

We will not be able to provide supervision for these students – we do not have enough non-PPTA teachers for this to happen.



Positive Behaviour for Learning - Thames High School ROLES

Thames High School is part of the Positive Behaviour for Learning (PB4L) model that looks at behaviour and learning from a school wide as well as an individual students' perspective.

The PB4L school-wide framework helps schools to build a culture where positive behaviour and learning is a way of life. The framework is tailored to each individual school, based on their own environment and cultural needs.

Thames High School PB4L kaupapa is centered around R.O.L.E.S.

Respect for Others, Respect for Learning, Respect for the Environment and Respect for Self. For 2 – 3 weeks we collectively, as a whole school, focus on a particular letter e.g. "O" Respect for Others and then in the next whole school assembly we celebrate how students have demonstrated this at each year level before focusing on the next letter, which in this case would be "L" Respect for Learning.

This model is not about changing the student, it's about changing the environment, systems and practices we have in place to support them to make positive behaviour choices.

Board of Trustees Election 2019

Kia ora whānau,

Voting papers for our Board of Trustees Election should be arriving in your mailbox now if you are eligible to vote in the election.

Please get in touch with me if you haven't received yours yet. Please take some time to read the candidate statements and place your vote on the voting paper.

IMPORTANT NOTE: All voting papers need to be received at the school by noon on election day (7 **June**) to be counted as valid. There is a voting box in our reception if you would like to drop it in rather than post it.

In accordance with legislation, a voting paper received after noon on election day is invalid, unless the voting paper was posted and the date stamp on the envelope shows that it was posted before noon on election day.

When is a vote invalid?

A vote is invalid for any of the following reasons:

- ·The voter votes more than once in the election
- ·The voter votes for more candidates than there are trustees to be elected
- The voting paper was not contained in the envelope included with the voting paper
- · The voting paper does not, in the opinion of the returning officer, clearly indicate the candidate or candidates for whom the voter intended to vote, or
- ·The returning officer believes on reasonable grounds that the voting paper was not issued to the voter by the returning officer
- ·There are two voting papers in one envelope



NCEA Fees

Tēnā koutou,

The Minister of Education has announced that families of secondary school students will no longer have to pay fees to enter NCEA and New Zealand Scholarship.

This charge will remove financial barriers and ensure all the credits received towards NCEA will be visible on students Record of Achievement.

These changes also mean schools no longer need to collect fees from around 168,000 New Zealand domestic students, or students from the Cook Islands and Niue, who are entering for NCEA and New Zealand Scholarship.

Any fees already collected from these students for 2019 will be refunded by schools. NZQA will be in contact soon with those schools which have already remitted fees, and NZQA will be working to award credits and qualifications earned in previous years where fees were not paid. In the first instance, any NCEA fees already paid will be credited towards any other outstanding fees on your child's account. If there are no fees outstanding the school will grant a full refund. The refund process will take a few weeks, so please be patient.

The Minster has also announced a range of improvements to NCEA, and that the Government will fund the continued roll out of the NCEA online programme.




