ERO update

Many thanks to all kaimahi (staff), tauira (students), whānau (parents and caregivers) that participated in the ERO evaluation at school after Easter.

A preliminary report will be presented to the board at the end of May, and we can expect a public report thereafter. ERO commented that they saw much progress since 2018 on how the school was addressing how we were ensuring equity and excellence for all, making use of information to identify and prioritise students who are currently below expectations.

We are committed to continuing to improve all that we do, and we are excited by the opportunity to continue to work with ERO in their new 'evaluation partner' model of engagement with schools.

Charter, Annual Plan and Annual Reports

You may have missed the publication of our updated Charter and Annual Plan for 2021.

The Charter is an important document that all schools must have that describes the board's priorities, and submitted to the Ministry of Education in March each year.

In addition, our 'analysis of variance' that includes the account of how well we achieve lasty year's goals and the progress we made in meeting our annual plan, has also been submitted to the Ministry of Education and is available on our website.

Both the **charter** and **analysis of variance** are available <u>on our website</u>.

The 2019 Financial Reports have been signed off by the auditors after significant delays due to Covid-19. <u>This is also available on our</u> <u>website</u>. Our 2020 accounts are about to be audited early next term in line with government requirements – a process that should be completed by 31 May each year.

School "Strike for Climate"

Approximately 40 of our tauira / students took part in the School Strike for Climate on Friday 9 April, joining an estimated 170,000 across the country. We are proud that the organisers of the Thames event are our very Lillian Balfour and Helena Meyer (Year 13), assisted by Oliver O'Neill (Year 13), Tyler Groenewald and Emma Fogg (Year 12).

We are all hoping that this is a sign that our Enviroschools group is supported by many students this year and can strengthen our commitment to sustainable environments and practices at the school.

If you have a concern

We always wish to address any concerns you have as soon as possible. In most cases it is about asking for clarification or an explanation – we are only too happy to help.

We have a full concerns and complaints process available on <u>School Docs</u>. The general principle is to resolve any issue directly with the person and as informally as possible.

In most cases a discussion and/or meeting will resolve most concerns, but if not, you can always seek further advice.

Any concern(s) raised with board members or the board chair will be referred to the principal to resolve, so please reserve communicating with the board chair to matters regarding the principal and/or other board members.

For convenience we outline the process below.



Raising Concerns

Our primary goal is to create the best learning environment for the students at our school.

We encourage open communication and prefer that you come to us to talk through any concerns rather than discussing them in the community.

1. Discuss the issue with the right person.

If you have a general concern about the school or its programmes, discuss it with the person involved or with a member of the senior leadership team or the principal.

For instance, if it is about a class/course, please contact the class teacher or relevant head of department.

If you have a particular concern about a staff member or a school activity, contact the person involved to discuss the matter privately.

We ask that you make this direct approach as soon as possible. Be prepared to make a time to discuss your concern if the person involved is unable to talk with you straight away. Be open to listening to the other side of the story to avoid communication breakdowns.

If you do not wish to approach the person involved, contact a member of the management team (head of department or senior leadership team) or the principal to discuss your concern. The principal or management team member may communicate with the person involved to clarify the situation.

If you have a concern about your own child or another student, contact the student's class teacher or the principal to discuss the matter.

If your concern relates to another student, you must not approach that student or their family directly.

If you have a concern about another parent, caregiver, or member of the school community on a school related matter, raise this with the principal. If the matter concerns the principal and you have not first resolved it by discussion, or you feel uncomfortable directly approaching the principal, contact the board chair.

If the matter concerns a board member, contact the board chair, or deputy chair if it concerns the board chair.

If you approach a board member with your concerns you will be asked to follow the guidelines above, and the board member will inform the principal and board chair.

2. Work towards a resolution.

In most cases, constructive discussion will resolve your concerns.

If you are unhappy with the outcome of your initial meeting, contact the principal, a member of the senior leadership team, or the board chair (if it concerns the principal or other board members) to discuss further resolution.

If this process does not resolve your concern, you can make a formal complaint.
