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## Introduction

We hope that you and your bubble are well, balancing the challenge of working and learning from home with ways of staying well.

<u>Previous pānui</u> have contained important information about staying well, links to get more support, whether that is for financial assistance, food, getting support for managing anxiety. There has also been advice about staying safe online and using the <u>Switch on Safety Filter</u>.

We will endeavour to get more of these these out from Tuesday 31 August 2021.

Today (Monday 30 August) the emphasis for the Kaiako / teachers and kaimahi is a well-being check, while taiohi can use the time to catch up, or reap the rewards for being fully up to date, and take the time to read for pleasure, exercise or spend tome supporting their siblings.

Thank you so much for advising of any issues experienced so that we can help taiohi/students get positively connected with their lessons. Whatever the reason, it is vital we know so we can help.

## Moving to Alert Level 3

Last Friday, the Government announced that we will move to **Alert Level 3** from Wednesday 1 September. Again, we have been here before, and we know what to do.

This cautious approach by the government is to eliminate Covid-19 again from our wider community (Aotearoa NZ). It is pleasing that vaccination rates are increasing so we can have more confidence that any Covid-19 infections will not lead to serious illness.

#### What level 3 means for us

For most there is no change as at Alert Level 3 schools will effectively continue to be closed, other than for the children of parents who need to go to work and have no alternative care options available.

Those who do have to come in will continue to engage in distance learning, as most staff will be busy ensuring that continues. At level 3 more businesses can open for business and so more people may be required to go to work.

#### The key messages are:

- Being on-site is only for children Year 9 10, i.e. those under 14 who cannot legally be at home alone, if that is required for their parent/caregiver to go to work.
- You should only send your child/ren to school if you need to, that is, if there is no suitable supervision for your child to ensure that they maintain the physical distancing
- If you need to send your child to school then you must advise us by 6 pm Monday 30 August so we can make suitable arrangements.



Parents/caregivers of Years 9 or 10 taiohi/student(s) who **need** to send their child(ren) to school must advise the school <u>Using this form</u>. By 6 pm **Monday 30 August**. If circumstances change after Monday then please still use this form and will will get in touch.

- There will be bubbles of no more than 10 with consistent staffing.
- If we need more than one bubble, they will remain more than 2 m away from each other.
- **School Buses** operators must be informed by the school that there are children needing to come to school, then they will put a service on.
- Students or staff that are unwell, or are required to self-isolate, **must stay at home.**
- To ensure the safety of those children and our staff who **need to** come to school, we will be operating with strict enforcement of health and safety measures, including
  - Contact tracing (QR code must be used)
  - **Register** of who is expected and who is on-site (attendance register)
  - o physical distancing of at least 1 m inside
  - Hand hygiene washing and use of hand sanitiser
  - Cough and sneeze etiquette
  - Regularly cleaning and disinfecting high touch surfaces (daily at Alert Level 3).
  - Suitable spaces will be arranged for students to engage with the distance / online learning planned and distributed to all students. There is no expectation that teachers are to prepare more than what they are preparing for all students.
- There will be no provision of a canteen, so anyone that needs to be on-site **must have their own morning tea**, lunch, and water bottle.
- There cannot be 'free' breaks where students can run and play around outside. There will be an opportunity to walk around outside at scheduled times, in a controlled way (physical distancing).
- Any students onsite, as always, must be in full correct uniform.

#### Looking ahead

It is natural that some will be anxious about returning to the classroom at level 3 (if needed) and Levels 2 and Level 1 when they come.

It's important to remember that throughout this pandemic the Government has taken a health-led, precautionary approach, so that if we move down Alert Levels, it will only be if it is safe to do so and the settings will support good health and safe practice.

As you have been doing, please keep connecting with your child's kaiako/teachers with any questions you might have.

## Changes that have happened due Covid-19 Alert Level 4

Several events and activities have been either deferred or cancelled because of Level 4 Alert, for example:

- Careers Expo (19 Aug) cancelled
- Northcote Sports Exchange (28 Sept) cancelled
- Winter Sports Tournament (week 6) cancelled
- NCEA Information Evening (26 Aug) Year 10s and Careers/Courses Advice (Years 11-12) – postponed – moving online.
- EOTC trips postponed at this stage, but uncertain about when or if these can be moved. e.g., OEC 101 ski trip.
- I am hope presentation (18 Aug) cancelled
- The K.ICK, Pillars of Strength and Healthy Relationships programmes – deferred: these will restart at Level 2 or Level 1.
- Year 8 Transition visits to primary schools deferred – we will advise but expect these to happen at Level 2 or Level 1.
- Sports competitions mixture of deferred and cancelled.
- Photolife Group protos postponed; to reschedule at Level 2 or Level 1.
- Gateway / STAR courses e.g. Health and Safety – deferred until further notice.
- The School Board is meeting online, Monday 30 August, rather than in person.
