Period 4 on each day is 70 minutes with all other periods being 75 minutes. There previously was a transition time between periods 2 and 3.

Break times will be more uniform across the week – lunch being 45 minutes and interval 25 minutes.

On days we have an assembly (typically on Monday) then we have slightly changed times, with periods 2 and 3 being 70 minutes each.

Junior Curriculum 2022

As reported earlier the way that Year 9 and 10 classes are organised has been reviewed after consultation. We are very pleased that the proposed changes have proved possible within the 2022 timetable. These changes are an extension to the changes made in 2021 which meant that learning programmes for Years 9 and 10 students were more consistent than in the past.

Year 9 – have a combination of whole-year core subjects and core term rotation subjects.

- English, Maths, Health and Physical
 Education and Science 3 periods per week
 for the whole year
- Social studies 2 periods per week for the whole year. Social studies will have an emphasis on local and Aotearoa history.
- The remaining six periods a week will consist of two sets of four subjects rotating for a term each. In 2022 the rotations are:
 - Music, Drama, Tikanga / Te
 Reo Māori, Digital
 Technologies
 - Art, Kai (Food), Materials Technology, Tikanga / Te Reo Māori

Year 10 – core subjects (12 periods a week) and semester options (8 periods a week)

- English, Maths, and Science 3 periods per week for the whole year
- Health, physical education, social studies and Tikanga / Te Ao Māori - 1 term each
- Three options (two with 3 periods a week and one with 2 periods a week). The options are still subject to change but are expected to be. Students will take two from each set of five options. Unfortunately, not everyone will get the their first two choices, but we think there is good variety on offer to cover the range of subjects expected in the NZ Curriculum.

Senior Course Confirmation (Years 11-13) Tuesday 1 February

Years 11 to 13 taiohi need to attend course confirmation on **Tuesday 1 February**.

If taiohi / students do not attend course confirmation they may not get the subjects that they want as subject sizes must be managed.

Years 12 and 13 11:00 am – 1:00 pm Year 11 1:30 pm – 3:00 pm

<u>All</u> Year 12 & 13 are required to confirm their timetable. They must go to the *School Hall at 11 am* to be welcomed back and to get information about the process to confirm their timetable.

Year 11 only attend course confirmation if there are gaps, clashes or changes requested.

An email will be sent by <u>Tuesday 25 January</u> confirming the provisional subjects in taiohi / students' timetables. This will indicate if option choices fit the timetable or clash.

Given our school is open for instruction on this day, taiohi / students are expected to arrive in **full school uniform**.

Year 13 Lunch and Study Passes

It is a privilege for Year 13 taiohi / students to go to town at lunchtime (not interval). They will be allowed only after we are assured that they are attending classes and have got their uniform to the standard expected.

Until that decision is made, they must remain onsite.

Once there is a pattern of meeting expectations of their presentation, behaviour, attendance, and punctuality, we will also consider the issuing of offsite study passes for study periods during period 1 or 4, from week 5 in Term 1.

Year 12 & 13 Individual Learning – (ILG)

ILG time is scheduled into Year 12 and Year 13 timetable to allow space for taiohi / students the opportunity to complete work not completed in their classes, homework or catch up on missed schoolwork, due to attending off site activities, work experience, Wintec etc during the school week. Taiohi / students will be allocated a room to work under supervision. Once good routines have been established then there is expected to be more flexibility in the use of this time. Taiohi / students should eb able to work (with permission) in other areas of the school, as needed for their studies, for example Art.



Year 11 Hauora Programme

This is a one-year compulsory course for all 11 taiohi / students. It is designed to provide taiohi / students with an overview of health and wellbeing. It embraces the four dimensions of hauora (Te Whare Tapa Whā)

- Mental health/Taha Hinengaro,
- Family health/Taha Whānau,
- Spiritual health/Taha Wairua,
- Physical health/Taha Tinana.

Pōwhiri – Wednesday 2 February

We expect that all Year 13 taiohi / students along with kaimahi / staff as Tangata Whenua (hosts) are at school on this day at 9 am for a 9.30 am start with pōwhiri for Year 9 taiohi / students and any new kaimahi / staff members and taiohi / students. Whānau are encouraged and welcome to attend.

At the conclusion of the powhiri, Year 13 taiohi / students will be assigned to a Year 9 $R\bar{o}p\bar{u}$ class to tautoko / support them during the day. The day finishes at 3:10 pm.

Buses

As advised earlier there was a review of bus contracts by the Ministry of Education.

<u>Go</u> <u>Bus</u> are the new providers of bus services from 2022. Their buses are white with a *Go Bus* logo on the side of the door.



With the new bus company come new guidelines for our taiohi / students.

These guidelines are:

- All students MUST be in Thames High School uniform to be picked up by the bus unless it is a Mufti Day.
- Only eligible students will be allowed on the bus route, based on the address which we have for them. Eligible students must be at least 4.8 km from the school.
- If an eligible student has invited a friend to their house, or they need to use an alternative bus to get to an event, or work, this MUST be communicated to the school, prior to them getting on the bus. This is for health and safety requirements, and to ensure that there will be enough space on the bus. Being allowed on the bus is at the discretion of the bus company and the

- school based on the number of students on the day and other factors which may affect eligible bus users.
- A signed contract will be required for all eligible students which will be sent out early in 2022. If the contract is not returned then alternative transport arrangements must be arranged by caregivers / parents.
- If there are any issues which arise with any taiohi / students on the buses, this may result in them being refused entry to the bus. This will be communicated in writing to the parent / caregiver by the school and / or bus company.
- There have been stops in the past where ineligible taiohi / students have been picked up. Go Bus are currently looking at ways where these stops may continue, though there may be a charge for this service as it is not funded by the Ministry of Education. When we have more details we will provide this to the users concerned.
- If you have any other issues or questions please contact the school and we will provide contact details of Go Bus.
