Kia ora e te Whānau

Nau mai, haere mai. Welcome to Thames High School for 2022.

As we prepare for the start of 2022 this pānui has some important information for our Year 9 taiohi/students.

Our first day for Year 9 taiohi/students is **Wednesday 2 February 2022**, **starting with a Powhiri**.

Please arrive by 9 am for a 9.30 am start. Details are below.

# **2022 Starting Programme**

Wed 26 Jan	School Office open for new enrolments and enquiries.
Wed 2 Feb	Powhiri for Year 9 and new taiohi / students and staff members. Orientation for Year 9 (Only Year 9 & 13 taiohi / students at school)
Thurs 3 Feb	Timetabled classes begin for all year levels.  Arrive by 8.35 am for 8.45 am start. School day starts at 8:45 am with a special Rōpu class.
Mon 7 Feb	Waitangi Day observed (no school)

#### **Powhiri**

We start the year with a powhiri for new taiohi / students and kaimahi / staff. Whānau are encouraged and welcome to attend.

As Manuhiri (visitors), please gather from 9:00 am for a 9:30 am start. Gather outside the waharoa (entrance to the Wharenui) on Sealey Street.

Wait for the karanga (calling) that begins the powhiri.

Tangata whenua (hosts) will be represented by all kaimahi and Year 13 taiohi.

#### **Orientation**

After the powhiri, taiohi will move to the hall, whānau are encouraged to join them. There will be tea and coffee and a biscuit (kai) to formally end the powhiri.

After kai, taiohi will be taken to their Rōpu class to begin their orientation activities. More detailed information will be out to whānau in Janurary.

End of day - The day ends at 3:10 pm.

## Rōpū class and organisation

In 2022 our Year 9 Rōpū will be organised by House groups which is a new concept. Here at Thames High School, house spirit is a focus for 2022. With our Rōpū organised into the house groups – Rudman House -blue, Adams House - Green, Hoult House- Yellow and Dorrington House – Red, this will lift the profile of our house system, along with more opportunities to connect with our senior school who are organised in Whānau by house groups.

Information about which Rōpu a taiohi will be in, will be sent out along with specific information for timetabled classes.

### **Bus information for 2022**

The bus services will be changing provider to Go Bus. The times and pick up locations will continue to be the same as in 2021. As part of the expectations for using this service taiohi/ students are to be in full school uniform and to exihibt 'Our Tikanga – Our ROLES' at all times. The bus service will be running on Wednesday 2 February for all students.

Period 4 on each day is 70 minutes with all other periods at 75 minutes. There previously was a transition time between periods 2 and 3, this time has now been allocated to Lunchtime. With a longer lunch break, activities and events can have time to be run for student engagement.

#### **Year 9 Curriculum**

A review of the structure of the curriculum at Years 9 has taken place.

The aim has been to understand the needs of our 2022 Year 9 cohort, to keep the strengths of creating a programme that is innovative and based within our local curriculum. To provide a programme that is created for the preparation of future studies.

# Highlights:

- Our Junior programme will feature year-long courses for literacy and numeracy (English and Math) where students will be working in their ropū class. These learning areas will be a focus of 2022.
- PE and Health, Social Studies and Science will also feature year-long programmes.

- Additional to this students will experience a range of curriculum areas from a variety of the following subjects: Music, Drama, Art, Technology, Digital technology, languages, Te Reo maori / Tikanaa.
- The school day will start at 8:45 am and finish at 3:10.
- Rōpu and Whānau classes will be after period 1. This was trialled in 2021 with success.

## Key features of the curriculum:

- 5 subjects which will be full-year which are;
   Math, English, Physical Education and Health,
   Social Studies and Science.
- Term Rotations of the following subjects which will give a taster of this subject area include; Art Digital Technology, Drama, Māori/Tikanga, Music, , Technology (Food, hard and soft materials).
- Themes throughout the year to bring cohesion across the curriculum.

# Stationery and BYOD

Stationery lists and the requirements for devices have been updated and <u>can be found on our website</u>.

Being prepared for class is a great start to making progress. Taiohi/students are expected to be organised and bring what they need to support their learning.

The basics include a school bag, stationery (books, paper, pens, etc.). A learning device is highly recommended.

As being prepared for class is a priority for all our taiohi, In 2022 we will provide each student with a stationary start-up pack using funds from our Equity Fund. This pack includes; 2 1B5 (lined), 1E5 (math), 3 pens, ruler, pencil, eraser, refill, colouring pencils. As a whānau you may want to purchase additional stationery. Each pack costs \$8, any donations towards this initiative are welcome
