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## NCEA Accord Day - Monday 22 August

The second of four Accord Teacher-Only days for 2022 is on **Monday 22 August**. There is **no** school for taiohi / students on this day.

There are four Teacher-Only days allocated in 2022 to support the implementation of changes to NCEA.

The dates of upcoming Accord Teacher-Only days are **Friday 25 November and Monday 28 November** although one of these days may be transferred to Term One next year to allow schools in our wider area to work together.

## Masks update

Thanks again to all taiohi and our community for supporting the expectation to wear masks for the first four weeks of term, following the request of the Associate Minister of Education.

From next week, when school resumes on Tuesday 23 August, we return to the standard expectation of the framework at Orange traffic light setting. This means, "masks must be worn by ākonga aged 12 and above on school and public transport. It is also strongly recommended by public health officials that face masks are worn by students and staff in Year 4 to 13 when indoors, including combined classes when learning and during indoor assemblies."

In cases and circumstances in our community indicate that there is an outbreak of winter sickness then we may return to the requirement, but that will be advised.

#### Parents' Forum

The parent's forum is a rōpū which meets once a month. The purpose of the forum is to provide information about Thames High School and to connect with Whānau. The format of our meetings is a 20-minute presentation of a topic with time for questions and then 30 minutes of an open forum.

## Mufti "Daffodil" Day

Daffodil Day symbolises hope for all New Zealanders impacted by cancer

To wear mufti, taiohi are expected to donate a gold coin to the cause - all proceeds go to the New Zealand Cancer Society. Donations will be collected in the morning and there are no IOUs. If someone can remember to wear mufti, then they can remember a coin OR they can pay by EFTPOS at the Accounts Office. Everyone is encouraged to wear something yellow, and they may also wear a daffodil or similar.

The normal dress code for a Mufti Day is clothing, although casual, that must be appropriate for a school workplace environment. This includes, but may not be limited to:



- No slogans referring to smoking, alcohol and drugs, any sexual connotations or any inappropriate signs or insignia.
- Footwear is to be smart / casual. Suitable footwear i.e. enclosed shoes must be worn for practical classes (Health & PE, Science and Technology)
- The normal expectations of hair colour apply, so please do not colour your hair for this day.
- Do not bring any props or costumes, as they be inappropriate or be distraction to learning in the classroom e.g no onesies, no themed outfits, or costumes.
- No bandanas are to be worn.

Should clothing that is deemed as not suited to the school workplace, the school reserves the right to ask students to change either into provided school uniform, if available, or the item(s) may be corrected with the help of caregivers / whānau. For consistency, decisions about what does and does not meet the standards above will be decided by members of the Senior Leadership Team. Parent and caregivers / whānau support is expected and appreciated.

### "I AM HOPE" Presentation

An ambassador of the Key to Life Charitable Trust, Tai Tupou, will be doing a presentation on the "I Am Hope" school programme (founded by Mike King).

The presentation is about "normalising the inner critic in mental health, encouraging young people to reach out for help, and giving examples of tools to keep themselves well and see hope through sharing our own journeys."

This was originally scheduled for Friday 19 August however will now be on Thursday 25 August from 2 pm, for all taiohi.

#### **PISA Involvement**

On Tuesday 23 August, a group of students between Years 10 and 12, who have been selected at random to represent Aotearoa New Zealand, will take part in PISA 2022. PISA is a large international research study that place every 3 years. There are 6,300 students from NZ and over half a million students from over 80 countries taking part.

PISA stands for the Programme for International Student Assessment. The study looks at how well students can use their knowledge in real world situations in three key areas: reading, mathematics, and science, as well as creative thinking. The study also collects information on student perceptions, attitudes and experiences and home and school environments. By taking part students will help the PISA organisation to understand and improve how

well our education system prepares students for life and success in the modern world.

Thanks to those students who have been randomly selected for taking part in PISA.
