Learning Recognition Credits

NZQA announced on 10 August that the learning recognition credit (LRC) system used in 2020 and 2021 is being used in 2022. This is to "recognise the impact student and teacher absences due to COVID-19 and other winter illnesses have had on teaching, learning and assessment this year." LRCs only are earned for credits earned in the current year.

What does this mean?

Summary of changes

 One Learning Recognition Credit (LRC) for every 5 credits earned through assessment

NCEA Level	Maximum LRCs
1	10
2	8
3	8

to a maximum of 10 for level 1 and 8 for levels 2 and 3. For those who qualify for the maximum number of LRCs the new totals of credits that need to be earned will be required for NCEA Level 1 is 70 credits, rather than 80. For Level 2 and Level 3, 52 credits, rather than 60.

- To receive a Certificate Endorsement, students will need 46 credits at Merit or Excellence level, instead of the usual 50.
- To be awarded University Entrance, students will need 14 credits in each of two UE Approved Subjects, and 12 credits in a third UE Approved Subject (they will also need to attain NCEA Level 3 and meet the regular literacy and numeracy requirements).
- The dates for Visual Arts portfolios and the Digital Technologies Common Assessment Task (DCAT) are not changing.
- Where learning needs to extend into 2023, NZQA help students be awarded their qualification earlier in the year, outside of the normal annual cycle. That means a student who doesn't complete Level 2 in 2022, who then completes sufficient credits early in 2023 can then be officially awarded NCEA Level 2.
- Externally assessed portfolios for some areas have also been moved back one week. This will only affect Technology (NCEA Levels 1-3) and Music (NZ Scholarship) at our school.

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Thames Valley Rugby

School Exams

Years 11 to 13 students sit examinations from **Thursday 15 September to Tuesday 20 September**. During this time, we will run an examination timetable. As for NCEA examinations, school exams are up to three hours long if taiohi are sitting three standards. Most subjects offer one or two external standards; some offer three and students are expected to sit all examinations that are part of their course.

The examinations have three main purposes.

- 1. They are great practice for the <u>NCEA</u> <u>external examinations</u>, to work out what needs to be worked on before the final examinations.
- 2. They assess level of understanding and application of the course material in class, proving evidence for the senior awards, such as first in subject and the special awards.
- 3. The provide evidence of derived grades if an <u>unexpected event</u> happens during the NCEA examination period.

Subjects having examinations

- Year 11/Level 1 English, Mathematics, Music, Geography, History and Science.
- Year 12/Level 2 Biology, Chemistry, English, Geography, Health, History, Mathematics, Music, and Physics.
- Year 13/Level 3 Biology, Chemistry, Calculus, English, Geography, Health, History, and Physics.

- Students taking Hospitality Mechanics, Furniture and Fabric classes will also have a one-hour sessions to help complete portfolio or practical work.
- Distance education students will sit their exams on Wednesday 14 September: Level 1 French and Spanish and Level 3 Japanese.

The final school examination timetable will be shared next week.

Study leave for Year 13 students only

Year 13 students who are entered in external papers, who do not have an examination will be on study leave from Thursday 15 September to Tuesday 20 September, unless they have an examination. This is for those who meet our attendance and values expectations. **Study leave means studying at home.** For those who travel by bus in the morning, they need to study quietly in the school library.

Year 11 and 12 students at school

While Year 11 and 12 students are sitting their examinations, those students who are not sitting an examination will be in supervised study classes or, if teachers are available, may be able to spend time in speciality rooms to complete their work.

- Preparing ('studying') for an examination in the future; or
- Catch up or complete internal assessments or external portfolio work.

Option selection for 2023

Years 9 to Year 12 students will begin their 2023 option choices soon. We need this information for next year's timetable. Information about this will be shared with taiohi in whānau and rōpu classes, including making wise decisions. More information about the process will be shared next week.

Closing dates for option selection:

- Years 10-12: Friday 23 September 2022 (Year 11-13 options for 2023)
- Year 9: Wednesday 28 September 2022 (Year 10 options for 2023)



NCEA and Options Information for parents

For parents of Year 10, who want to know more about NCEA and senior options, or for anyone else that would like a refresher, we will hold a **NCEA and Options Information session** in the THS Library on Monday 19 September at 6.00 to 7.00 pm.

As always, all courses in 2023 are subject to sufficient students opting for them and being able to schedule the right teachers at the right times (i.e. timetabling). That means that taiohi will typically be asked to select 'reserve' options.

Eva Hammond Scholarship Trust Award

Any past student who is about to commence a course of tertiary education including students who are within 6 months of leaving Thames High School for that purpose are eligibility to apply.
