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This pānui is a brief update on upcoming events and dates.

NCEA Exams continue

NZQA examinations continue, the last one at Thames high School is on Thursday 24 November.

Full schedule (NZQA Website)

Students coming onsite for exams, tutorials and other reasons are expected to be in correct uniform.

Junior (Year 9 and 10) School Exams

Exams for Years 9 and 10 are on **Monday 21 November and Tuesday 22 November**.

There are three exams over the two days for Science, English and Mathematics. Exams are 90 minutes long and will be held in the school hall for all Year 10 and in separate classrooms for Year 9 rōpū. Taiohi/students with Special Assessment Conditions (SAC) will have access to separate accommodation and a teacher aide or teacher support if eligible. Monday will follow the regular school schedule, except for the shorter period 3 class, while Tuesday has different times.

For each exam taiohi/students will need a pen and refill paper. It is a good habit to come prepared for exams as those the senior school must.

A calculator is also needed for the Science and Math exams; however, each department has an allocation of calculators for students who do not have a calculator.

As noted in a previous pānui, the exams are to help assess progress and understanding in core areas and to build confidence in this form of assessment, so that students are better prepared for external examinations for NCEA in the future.

Teachers are helping taiohi prepare for these assessments in class, helping with revision, practice tasks and hints on how to work to a time limit.

Some basic tips for exams are:

- Plan to have revision time, well ahead of time. Don't cram. Do your study in a place where you won't get distracted.
- Take regular breaks and stay hydrated.
- Focus on what is going to be covered, know your topics.
- Make your own summaries, use tools like mind maps and flip cards to help.



- You may find studying as a group very helpful; either way get help from your friends who are also preparing.
- Practice answering questions, and check and correct answers.
- Get help and feedback from your teacher.
- Make sure you are well rested for an exam and feed the machine – make sure you have good food and drink plenty of water.
- In the examination, do your best topics first, then make sure you attempt all the parts, keeping to the suggested time limits.

Staff only days

Topics will include more about how to prepare for the <u>changes to literacy and numeracy requirements</u>. While these have been delayed again, the changes are still coming, along with all the new standards for subjects – full implementation by 2024.

These days will give our departments time to ensure we have the foundations in place at Year 9 and 10, and to get ready for the implementation in 2024.

Paid Union Meeting

The PPTA have announced that there will be a paid union meeting in our area on **Wednesday 30 November** (1.30 - 3.30 pm). This is to consider the offer from the Ministry of Education and to decide the next steps in their collective agreement negotiations.

New Zealand employment law allows every union to have two paid union meetings each year during normal working hours. This is the second. As most teaching staff are union members, we cannot hold classes period 4. Periods 1 to 3 will be as normal (at slightly different times). Students <u>may</u> finish school at 12.45 pm and **go home.** Buses have been arranged to come earlier and will leave soon after 12.45 pm.

Those who are unable to be at home will be supervised at school. We will have a lunch break followed by supervision in the library until the normal end of school.

Year 9 and 10 Prizegiving

Monday 5 December is our Junior Prizegiving in the School Hall, starting at 1.00 pm in the School Hall. This event is to acknowledge the diligence and achievement of taiohi / students.
