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# **Mufti Day Fundraiser**

We are having a Mufti Day Fundraiser on **Friday 24 February** to raise funds to help those affected by the devastating storm caused by Cyclone Gabrielle.

Taiohi / students are encouraged to give a donation of at least \$2 where proceeds raised will go to the Red Cross and/or Mayoral Relief Funds. Red Cross is on the ground dealing with immediate welfare needs and supporting people's emotional, practical and social needs. Mayoral Relief Funds help local communities support whānau, community organisations and marae after an emergency.



The dress code for Mufti Day is clothing, although casual, that must be appropriate for a school workplace environment. This includes, but may not be limited to:

- No slogans referring to smoking, alcohol and drugs, any sexual connotations.
- Footwear is to be smart/casual. School shoes will be issued to taiohi / students who wear inappropriate footwear. Suitable footwear i.e. enclosed shoes must be worn for practical classes (Health & PE, Science and Technology)

- No bandanas are to be worn.

Should clothing that is deemed as not suited to the school workplace, the school reserves the right to ask students to change either into provided school uniform, if available, or the item(s) may be corrected with the help of caregivers / whānau. For consistency, decisions about what does and does not meet the standards above will be decided by members of the Senior Leadership Team. Parent and caregivers / whānau support is expected and appreciated.

### **Industrial Action**

The proposed employment contract for teaching staff has not been agreed between the Ministry of Education and the PPTA Te Wehengarua members (the secondary teachers' union).

The PPTA has advised of two actions.

- 1. A ban on relief, Term 1 2023.
- 2. Proposed strike, 16 March 2023.

### Ban on relief

When teachers are absent for whatever reason, including sickness, trips, professional development, and many other reasons, we look to employ relief teachers to cover classes.

When we do not have sufficient cover as there may be no relievers available, we ask teachers to volunteer to forgo their non-contact time to cover classes, and we are generally very fortunate that staff agree. It has been especially difficult during covid times to get enough relievers. This is the banned activity – union members are not allowed to agree to use their non-teaching time to cover another class. This may be an issue especially when we have short notice absences, such as sickness.

What this means is that the amount of cover that we have available is less flexible, and that may mean we are short of staff. A range of approaches may be taken, including (but not excluding other ways):

- Combining classes and supervising them with one teacher rather than two.
- Reduce the number of times 'discretionary leave' is granted to lessen the chances of shortages.
- Rostering home a year level to allow more cover for classes that remain at school. This may mean we say school is open for Years 9-11, but not Year 12 and 13s, etc.

We would aim to give as much notice as possible if we are short of staff.

As the action is for Term 1, and sickness is normally lower than other terms, we hope we are not left short of staff, and hope we can manage any shortages of teachers, with having to roster home or combine classes.

We have several relieving teachers, but they are in lots of demand by other schools.

## Potential strike day

PPTA Te Wehengarua members have voted for a one-day national strike in Term 1 2023.

They have advised the date for this strike is **Thursday 16** March 2023.

Formal notice will be given by Monday 13 March.

Hopefully the strike will not go ahead, and the parties will continue negotiations and reach agreement.

As most of our teachers are union members we would be unable to safety staff the school, and would advise students to remain at home. We have some capacity to supervise younger students if needed.
