Staff only days

We have two staff only days for professional learning and development in the first two weeks of next term. On these days school is closed for instruction.

The first of these days is **Monday 24 April** where departments will be updating their understanding of the <u>NCEA changes</u> that are due to come into effect in 2024 at level one (Year 11). This day was approved by the board recognising there is a lot of work for teaching staff to be ready for these changes.

Because Anzac Day is on Tuesday 25 April, the first day back to school will be Wednesday 26 April.

The second day is on **Friday 5 May**, which is one of two days in 2023 that the Ministry of Education has allowed for schools to understand the changes to our national curriculum. <u>Te Mātaiaho</u> is the refreshed Aotearoa / New Zealand Curriculum framework. On this day we will have several 'big picture' conversations about our curriculum for the years ahead and continue the work we have begun to refresh our school curriculum to be more culturally responsive.
