Option selections for 2024

Term 4 – weeks 1 and 2

All option selections for 2024 for Year 9 to Year 12 students will happen early Term 4.

Details will be sent by email so that students and parents can look at the course descriptions in SchoolPoint. Students sign in and can 'favourite' the courses they are interested in, ideally with caregiver input.

In Week 1 (starting Monday 9 October), students will receive advice and guidance about option selection in their whānau / rōpū and can continue "favourite" their choices.

This advice adds to the careers education modules for all levels that have been provided in whānau / rōpū class by our career's adviser, Ms Donovan.

The **deadline** to complete option selections is **Wednesday 18 October** (week 2). Kaitiaki and Kaiāwhina will follow up on anyone who hasn't made their choices by then.

The choices are important as they help work out what we offer next year. Back up options are needed as timetable clashes are always likely.

NCEA and Option Information for parents

We have an opportunity for parents and caregivers to hear more about NCEA and options on **Wednesday 11 October** at **6.00 to 7.00 pm**, held in the **THS Library.**

First there will be a summary of how NCEA works, including the changes that come into effect from 2024.

Following this there will be an opportunity to ask questions and get help with selecting options for next year. We will break into groups for Year 9s making option choices for the first time and those in Years 10-12 making choices for NCEA courses.

Teacher only day

The next teacher only day that is provided for teachers to implement the changes to NCEA and the 'refreshed curriculum' is on Monday 13 November 2023.

We have chosen that date as the external advisors working with our teachers are available.

2024 Key Dates

The start dates and other key dates for 2024 are at the end of this update. All dates are subject to change, and more details will be sent out in due course.

Uniform Guidelines Ratified

The board considered the feedback from the consultation survev about the uniform guidelines.

Along with our new look uniform, we will have updated guidelines that will take effect from 2024.

Once the guidelines are finalised these will be published on our website.

Key findings

82% supported the overall intent of the new quidelines.

70% agreed with the expectations.

85% agreed with the overall statement about presentation standards.

There was broad support for a more contemporary, less conservative expectation on aspects like hair length and style, jewellery and accessories, tatoos/tā moko. That is, 'version two' of the proposed guidelines, with some exceptions.

For footwear there was broad support for the continued expectation of plain black shoes with no visible brands or markings, and similar guidelines for sandals.

The guidelines or processes about equity support, uniform passes, consequences for incorrect uniform, and exemptions.



Phone use in school – update

We surveyed parents, students, and staff about the level of control (or banning) phones at our kura (school).

The initial results were discussed by the board.

Now the status quo remains in place, namely that phones are NOT ALLOWED to be used at all in class time.

The board has committed to further discussing the matter, and how a new policy may be developed for 2024.

Some of the key findings were:

"No phones in class time. No exceptions. Allowed only at break times." (Current setting)

- 81% of parents agreed.
- 66% of students agreed.

"No phones at school – keep them at home! They become a banned item".

- 36% of parents agreed.
- Only 4% of students agreed with this!

No phones from 8.45 to 3.15 pm, including breaks. No exceptions.

- 58% of parents agreed.
- 10% of students agreed.
- 88% of staff agreed.

NCEA Examinations and study leave

NCEA examinations start on **Monday 6** November,

The examinations continue until **Friday 2 December.** The Links to the full timetable are here:

2023 Examination Timetable (download pdf)

Exams start at **9.30 am** in the morning session and **2 pm** in the afternoon session, and last for up to three hours. Candidates must make sure they are here well before the start time. Advice from NZQA:

> Arrive at least 20 minutes before the exam starts ...Late entries to the exam room are very limited, and there is no entry under any circumstances after 30 minutes.

Candidates will be issued an individual timetable, instructions, and admission slips from NZQA.

Guidelines for the examinations

Study Leave arrangements.

Students who are on track for achieve NCEA and have external assessments or who have completed their NCEA qualification, study leave will start from **Thursday 2 November**, i.e., the day after senior prizegiving.

Students allowed study leave will only need to attend school when they have an examination. It is important to consider any transport arrangements needed. For those who need to bus into school, there will be suitable space in the library for on-site quiet study before an examination.

Students that are not on track to achieve NCEA and who need to complete internal assessments will not be on study leave. They typically may have few external exams and a custom programme of extra support will be put in place with Mrs Donovan and the learner support team, including Mrs S Brown.
